


There were fewer reports in January 2021 compared to January of last year, mostly due to classes not starting until January 25 this year and many students still participating in on-line instruction from other locations. One item of note is that the average preliminary BAC for OWIs this month was .171, compared to a level of .141 during January of last year. Also, the average BAC for public intoxication arrests this month was .273, compared to .213 during January of last year. Calls for service were higher for January 2021 compared to January of last year, mostly due to a large increase in the number of extra patrols being conducted and documented in campus buildings and on ISU properties.





There were fourteen different incidents documented by reports of criminal mischief, vandalism, or other unacceptable behavior in residence halls. The majority of incidents included exit signs being damaged, bathroom wall items being broken, and posters/bulletin boards being altered in different ways.


There were eleven OWI reports during February. Testing was refused in two of the cases. In the remaining cases, the average preliminary BAC was .187, with the highest level .290 and the lowest BAC level .116. During February 2020, the average BAC was .102.


There were 4 public intoxication arrests during February. BAC testing was refused in one of the arrests. Of the individuals that were tested, the average BAC was .201, with the highest reading .245 and the lowest 0.133. In February of 2020, only 2 individuals were able to be tested, one BAC was .176, the other BAC was .297.





There was an increase in the number of reports and calls for service in March 2021 compared to March of last year. This increase is mostly due to the timing of the COVID-19 pandemic. In 2020, students left campus for spring break in March, and the majority did not return as there was a shift to on-line learning.

During the first quarter of 2021, six incidents required response to resistance (use of force), 125 arrests, and 5,062 calls for service. Response to resistance incidents represented 4.8% of arrests and .12% of all calls for service during this time.





There were several reports and calls for service for criminal mischief, vandalism, and trespassing on campus:


- Individuals putting soap into the Memorial Union fountain as well as swimming in it.

Year to date, criminal mischief/vandalism incident counts are up 176.9% over the first four months of 2020. Some of this increase is due to an increased effort to report these incidents.






There were two public intoxication arrests during May 2021. Testing was refused in one case and unable to be performed in the other. In May of 2020 there were no arrests for public intoxication.





In June of 2021 there was an increase in both calls for service and reports written over June of 2020. The majority of this increase can be explained by pandemic timing and response. It is important to remember during the summer months there are usually smaller numbers reported which can cause the percentage increases/decreases to seem extreme, and year to date data is more reliable in spotting ongoing trends. Year to date activity includes increases of 40.2% in traffic stops, 33.7% in written reports, and 23.5% in all calls for service

During the second quarter of 2021, there was one incident requiring response to resistance (use of force), 86 arrests, and 4,203 calls for service. Response to resistance incidents represent 1.16% of arrests and 0.02% of calls for service during this time.



Through July of 2021 there continues to be an increase in both calls for service and reports written over the previous year. The majority of this increase can be explained by pandemic timing and response. Year to date activity includes increases of 36.2% in traffic stops, 33.2% in written reports, and 25.0% in all calls for service. Incidents of catalytic converter thefts have contributed to an increase of 450.0% in theft from motor vehicle reports, but that number represents only an increase of 9 reports. As the fall semester starts, areas to watch include criminal mischief/vandalism reports (up 144.4% for the year), and welfare checks/medical assists (up 26.3% for the year)

There were four reports of stolen bicycles during the month of July. Three of the bicycles were locked. Information on the fourth bicycle taken from Parks Library was not available.





- One individual sent pictures to a friend of himself self-harming by cutting. It was determined that he was in contact with family and he was also given mental health resources.


- Concerned family overseas called about a student going through a divorce. A welfare check was conducted and he was informed of resources.

Additionally, there were two medical assistance reports. One involved an individual who was intoxicated and one individual who was injured in a skateboarding accident at the East Campus Parking Deck.

There were five OWI incident counts during November 2021. Testing was refused in one arrest. The BAC ranged from .092 to .153, with the average data master BAC being .119. During November 2020 there were eleven OWI reports involving alcohol. Testing was done in eight arrests, with the BAC ranging from .101 to .0199, and the average BAC .139.





In December of 2021 there was an increase in reports and calls for service, while traffic stops decreased 4.6% over the previous year. A large function of this would be that the 2020 fall semester ended before Thanksgiving due to the Covid-19 pandemic. Year to date activity includes increases of 6.0% in traffic stops, 25.9% in written reports, and 19.4% in all calls for service. Some trends seen during 2021 include sizeable increases in theft, criminal mischief/vandalism, and sex assault reports, as well as welfare checks/medical assists

There were three OWI incident counts during December 2021. The BAC ranged from .109 to .136, with the average data master BAC being .122. During December 2020 there were eight OWI reports, one involving drugs. Alcohol testing was refused in two cases. In the remaining five cases, the initial BAC ranged from .119 at the lowest to .200 at the highest. The average initial BAC in OWI reports for December was .158.
