In the reports where BAC testing was done, the average data master BAC was .164, with the highest level .235 and the lowest BAC level .09.




There were thirteen OWI incident counts during February 2022. In one incident the BAC was .053 and the driver was charged with a .02 violation. Data master testing was refused in three incidents and in those incidents the initial BAC recorded was .097, .183, and .300. In the remaining nine incidents, the BAC ranged from 0.14 to .201, with the average data master BAC being .168. During February of 2021 there were eleven OWI reports with testing refused in two incidents. In the reports where BAC testing was done, the average data master BAC was .180, with the highest level .275 and the lowest BAC level .116.



In February 2021 there were 4 public intoxication arrests, and of the three individuals that were tested the average BAC was .201, with the highest reading .245 and the lowest .133.





Calls for service for May 2022 were again at a higher level than the previous 4 years. Compared to May of 2021, traffic stops were up 108.1%, reports written were up 74.5%, and all calls for service were up 49.2%. Year to date, calls for service are up 15.6%. Also, year to date, criminal mischief/vandalism incidents are up 27.5% and OWIs are up 26.1%. Alcohol violations are down 17.1% for year to date and drug violations are almost the same, being down just 1.6%.





Calls for service for June 2022 were again at a higher level than the previous 4 years. Compared to June of 2021, traffic stops were up 122.9%, reports written were down 8.1%, and all calls for service were up 20.4%. Year to date, calls for service are up 16.4% and traffic stops are up 32.8%. Theft reports appear to have leveled off, being down slightly for June 2022 as well as year to date. Criminal mischief reports also leveled off for the month of June, and year to date are

still up 26.2%. OWIs are up 34.0% for the year, with drug violations up 12.3% and alcohol violations down 12.2% for the year.

July calls for service continued the trend of being higher than calls experienced in the current month than for the previous 4 years and were up 47.9% over July of 2021. Compared to July of 2021, traffic stops were up 77.5% and reports written were up 40.4%. Year to date, calls for service are up 20.5% and traffic stops are up 38.9%, while reports written are up 9.3%. There was an increase in criminal mischief reports during July, and year to date criminal mischief reports are up 36.4%. August calls for service were the highest experienced in August for the previous 4 years, and were up 42.0% over August of 2021. November calls for service were the highest experienced in November for the previous 4 years and were up 69.6% over November of 2021. Traffic stops were up 80.5% and reports written were up 38.0% over November of 2021. Year to date calls for service are up 34.0%, traffic stops are up 52.0%, and reports written are up 21.9%. Reports written for criminal mischief/vandalism incidents, OWI enforcement, alcohol/drug violations, and traffic activity violations were the main drivers for the increased activity.




There were twelve OWI incident counts during November 2022. In two of the incidents BAC testing was refused. One incident involved possible drug usage and a urine sample was collected for testing. In the remaining incidents the Datamaster BAC ranged from .092 to .188, with the average being .132. There were five OWI incidents during November 2021. Testing was refused in one arrest. The BAC ranged from .092 to .153, with the average data master BAC being .119.

There were six public intoxication reports during November 2022. Testing was refused in four reports. In one report the BAC registered above .08, in the other the BAC was .145. During November of 2021 there were three public intoxication arrests. Testing was refused in one of the arrests. In the remaining two arrests, the BAC was .211 for one individual and .261 for the other.








