




There was a dramatic increase in the number of calls for service in January 2023. The majority of the increase was the result of increased extra patrols, a change in the logging of safety escorts due to the new Iowa State Safe app, and more traffic stops. The increase in reports for January 2023 came from a larger number of OWIs and traffic stops involving driving violations and drug offenses

There were 2 reports of stolen bicycles during January.

The following graph shows Computer Aided Dispatch events with a mental health aspect for the month of January from 2019 - 2023.




There was one medical assistance report with an individual who had taken too much Rx medication. It was not a suicide attempt, and they were transported to Mary Greeley Hospital.


There were twenty OWI incident counts during January 2023. Testing was refused in four incidents and drugs were involved in another. In the remaining cases, the Datamaster BAC ranged from .033 to .296, with the average Datamaster BAC being .158. During January of 2022 there were seven OWI reports. Testing was refused in two incidents and drugs were involved in another. In the remaining cases, the BAC ranged from 0.94 to .202, with the average Datamaster BAC being .152.


There were two public intoxication reports for the month of January 2023. Testing was refused in one incident, and the BAC was .063 in the other incident. There were two public intoxication reports for the month of January 2022. Testing was refused in one incident, and the BAC was .206 in the other incident.







There was an increase in traffic stops (19.9%), cases written (14.9%), and all calls for service (62.4%) during February of 2023 compared to February of 2022. The increase in calls for service was mostly driven by extra patrols. Harassment reports are slightly increased from 2022, with theft and criminal mischief about the same year to date. Drug and alcohol violations are both up for the month of February as well as year to date. A portion of the increase in drug violations can be tied to an increased number of traffic stops with drugs being present in the vehicles. OWI violations were the same in February 2023 compared to February of 2022, but year to date are up 65%.


There were no reports of stolen bicycles during February. During January there were 2 reports of stolen bicycles. There was a call for service which indicated several cut/broken bicycle locks were present on the bicycle racks at Helser Hall, but no reports of stolen bicycles were taken during February. There have been a few reports in early March regarding stolen bicycles from the Helser racks.




During February of 2023 there were thirteen OWI incident counts. Testing was refused in three incidents and drugs were involved in two other incidents. In the remaining cases, the Datamaster BAC ranged from .085 to .233, with the average Datamaster BAC being .149. There were thirteen OWI incident counts during February 2022. In one incident the BAC was .053 and the driver was charged with a .02 violation. Testing was refused in three incidents. In the remaining nine incidents, the BAC ranged from 0.14 to .201, with the average data master BAC being .168.


There were three public intoxication reports for the month of February 2023. The BAC ranged from .190 to .227, and the average BAC was .214. During February of 2022 there were also three public intoxication reports. The BAC ranged from .151 to .249, and the average BAC was .213.








There was a large increase in traffic stops (68.0%), cases written (21.6%), and all calls for service (83.5%) during March of 2023 compared to March of 2022. The increase in calls for service was mostly driven by extra patrols. There was a large increase in theft cases during March of 2023, and year to date theft reports are up 52.9%. Increased OWI enforcement continues with an increase of 36.4% in incidents and 54.8% year to date

There were 5 reports of stolen bicycles during March, all of which had been locked. The average value of the bicycles taken during March was \$680.


During the first quarter of 2023, there were six incidents requiring response to resistance (use of force), 143 arrests, and 8,983 calls for service. Response to resistance incidents represent 4.2% of arrests and 0.07% of calls for service during this time.


During March of 2023 there were fifteen OWI incident counts. Testing was refused in three incidents, testing was unable to be done in one incident with a search warrant for a blood draw served, and drugs were involved in two other incidents with urine samples collected (including one incident where the Datamaster BAC was .074). In the remaining cases, the Datamaster BAC ranged from .096 to .281, with the average Datamaster BAC being .144. There were eleven OWI incident counts during March 2022. In one incident the BAC was .063 and the driver was charged with a .02 violation. Data master testing was refused in one other incident. In the remaining nine incidents, the BAC ranged from 0.08 to .233, with the average data master BAC being .139.


There were four public intoxication reports for the month of March 2023. Testing was refused in one of the reports. In the remaining reports the BAC ranged from .076 to .226, and the average BAC was .191. There were four public intoxication reports for the month of March 2022. Testing was refused in two of the reports. In the remaining two reports the BAC was .147 and .265.








During April proactive action continued to drive statistics with another large increase in traffic stops (66.7%), cases written (13.5%), and all calls for service (37.9%) during April of 2023 compared to April of 2022. The increase in calls for service was mostly driven by extra patrols. There were increases in harassment/stalking cases and criminal mischief/vandalism during April of 2023. Year to date, harassment cases are up 35.3%, theft cases are up 31.0%, OWIs are up 36.2% and criminal mischief/vandalism reports are unchanged.

There were 2 reports of stolen bicycles during April, both had been locked. The average value of the bicycles taken during April was \$600.


During March of 2023 there were 5 reports of stolen bicycles, two were from Helser Hall.




During April of 2023 there were sixteen OWI incident counts. Testing was refused in three incidents. Drugs were involved in two other incidents with a urine sample collected for one report and refused in another. In the remaining cases, the Datamaster BAC ranged from .091 to .181, with the average Datamaster BAC being .136. There were sixteen OWI incident counts during April 2022. Two incidents involved drugs, a test was unable to be done in one incident, and two individuals refused testing. In the remaining eleven incidents, the BAC ranged from .069 to .182, with the average DataMaster BAC being .143.




Activity in May of 2023 was similar to May of 2022. Proactive action continued to impact statistics with another large increase in traffic stops (33.0%), cases written (4.2%), and all calls for service (43.8%) during May of 2023 compared to May of 2022. There were increases in alcohol violations (75.0%) and decreases in drug violations (-50.0%) during May of 2023. Criminal mischief/vandalism incidents were down 20% during May, and down slightly (3.9%) year to date. Year to date, assault cases are down -44.4%, harassment reports are up 31.6%, theft is up 14.6%, alcohol violations are up 50.0%, drug violations are up 10.0%, and OWIs are up 27.1%.

There was just 1 report of a stolen bicycle in May which had been stolen over spring break.



In the remaining cases, the Datamaster BAC ranged from .083 to .224, with the average Datamaster BAC being .134. There were twelve OWI incident counts during May 2022. In two of

the incidents BAC testing was refused. An additional three incidents involved possible drug usage and urine samples were collected for testing. In the remaining incidents the Datamaster BAC ranged from .078 to .142, with the average being .110.





The following chart represents June Computer Aided Dispatch events with a mental health aspect from 2019 – 2023.




There were six OWI incidents for the month of June 2023. In one report drug use was suspected and a urine sample was collected for testing. In the remaining cases the Datamaster BAC ranged from .113 to .212, with the average Datamaster BAC being .161. There were fourteen OWI incident counts during June 2022. In three of the incidents BAC testing was refused. An additional four incidents involved possible drug usage and urine samples were collected for testing. In the remaining incidents the Datamaster BAC ranged from .108 to .221, with the average being .140.

There was one public intoxication report for the month of June 2023 and testing was refused. There was one public intoxication report for the month of June 2022, and the BAC was .271.

During the second quarter of 2023, there was one incident requiring response to resistance (use of force), 129 arrests, and 8,264 calls for service. Response to resistance incidents represent 0.78% of arrests and 0.01% of calls for service during this time.




The following chart represents June Computer Aided Dispatch events with a mental health aspect from 2019 – 2023.






Activity in August of 2023 was higher than that of August of 2022 when looking at calls for service (up 24.0%), case reports (up 10.3%), and calls for service (up 24.0%). Year to date, traffic stops are up 39.2%, case reports are up 19.0%, and calls for service are up 52.8%. Much of the increase in calls for service can be attributed to self-initiated proactive calls. Theft reports were down for the month of August compared to August last year, and year to date theft reports are down 4.9%. Reported sex assaults have increased modestly, but the underlying numbers are relatively small and the percentage increases can be misleading. There were many alcohol violations associated with Cyclone Welcome weekend and the first home game of the football season, but fewer alcohol citations were written for Cyclone Welcome Weekend this year compared to last year.



Activity in September of 2023 was higher than that of September of 2022 when looking at traffic stops (up 21.7%), case reports (up 25.0%), and calls for service (up 8.2%). Year to date, traffic stops are up 35.2%, case reports are up 19.2%, and calls for service are up 42.7%. 


The following chart represents September Computer Aided Dispatch events with a mental health aspect from 2019 – 2023.


Activity in October of 2023 was higher than that of October of 2022 when looking at traffic stops (up 17.2%) and calls for service (up 12.9%). Reports written were down 22.6%, mostly due to one less home football game in October 2023 compared to last year. 


Activity in November of 2023 was mixed. Traffic stops were down 4.0%, while reports written increased by 13.3% and calls for service were up 16.4%. 

The following chart represents November Computer Aided Dispatch events with a mental health aspect from 2019 – 2023.







Activity for incidents in December of 2023 was generally lower overall except for alcohol violations and welfare checks/medical assists. Traffic stops were up 49.3% and all calls for service were up 14.6%, while reports written decreased by 13.3% and calls for service were up 16.4%. Traffic stops are up 29.8% annually, reports written by 12.2%, and calls for service increased by 35.1%. Year to date, the largest changes were seen in harassment reports (up 66.7%), theft (down 28.7%), criminal mischief (down 6.8%) and OWIs (down 23.4%). Year to date traffic stops were up 31.0%, reports written were up 8.9%, and all calls for service were up 34.7%.

There were no bicycles reported stolen during the month of December 2023.

There were five OWI incidents for the month of December 2023. Testing was refused in two of the reports. In the remaining incidents the Datamaster BAC ranged from .120 to .194 with the average being .147. There were twenty OWI incident counts during December 2022. In three of the incidents BAC testing was refused. Two incidents involved possible drug usage and a urine sample was collected for testing. In the remaining incidents the Datamaster BAC ranged from .064 to .217, with the average being .121.

There were five public intoxication reports for the month of December 2023. Testing was refused for all of the incidents. There were three public intoxication reports during December 2022. Testing was refused in two reports and unable to be done in another.

During the fourth quarter of 2023, there was one incident requiring response to resistance (use of force), 29 arrests, and 2,501 calls for service. Response to resistance incidents represents 3.45% of arrests and 0.04% of calls for service during this time.
