There was a decrease in most activity in April 2024 compared to the prior year. There were five sexual assault reports during April 2024. Harassment reports were down a third in April 2024, and year to date are down slightly. Motor Vehicle Theft is up for the year, the majority of reports are for electric bicycles. OWIs are down considerably with only four written for the month of April 2024 and year to date are down almost 66.0%. For April, traffic stops were down 48.9%, calls for service were down 1.2%, arrests were down 53.6%, and the number of charges were down 61.6%. Reports written were down 5.6% and outreach events were down 20.%.


There were 2 reports of stolen bicycles during April of 2024, both were electric bikes.

- A locked electric mountain bike was taken from 81 Frederiksen Court 3/30/24 0830 3/31. It was an SMLRO valued at \$1180.
- A locked electric bicycle was taken from Helser Hall between 0630 4/22 and 0600 4/23. It was a Sohams valued at \$800. The owner had previously removed the battery and seat before the theft.

There were four OWI incident counts during the month of April 2024. In those cases, the Datamaster BAC ranged from .126 to .155, with the average Datamaster BAC being .140. During April of 2023 there were sixteen OWI incident counts. Testing was refused in three incidents. Drugs were involved in two other incidents with a urine sample collected for one report and refused in another. In the remaining cases, the Datamaster BAC ranged from .091 to .181, with the average Datamaster BAC being .136.

There were two public intoxication reports during April 2024. Testing was refused in one incident and the BAC in the other incident was .199. There were three public intoxication reports for the month of April 2023. Testing was refused in two of the reports. In the remaining report the BAC was .180.


The following chart represents April Computer Aided Dispatch events with a mental health aspect from 2020–2024.
